Congress had been out of session since late December and the House reconvened on January 12, 2010. The Senate returns next Tuesday, the 19th, and their first order of business will be work on legislation to raise the debt ceiling. The debt ceiling legislation will feature a debate on creating a deficit commission and statutory changes in paygo. Upon completing of debt ceiling legislation, the two Chambers will spend much of the next few weeks on merging and debating their respective health reform bills that they passed late last year.

Congressman Nunes Backs Pombo's Bid

California Republican Representative Devin Nunes Thursday endorsed former Representative

Richard Pombo's bid to succeed retiring Republican Rep. George Radanovich, the Fresno Bee reported. Nunes called Pombo, who served in the 11th District from 1992-2006, "a man of conviction" who was "wronged by the politics of Washington in the past." Pombo will face state Sen. Jeff Denham, who has the backing of Radanovich, and former Fresno Mayor Jim Patterson in the Republican primary.
